

AUTO-GENERATED TRANSCRIPT: What is Racist?

Hey, ladies and gentlemen, welcome back to the Steadfast and Loyal program.

You know, this week, I had the opportunity to speak with Georgia State Representative Mesha Mainor. And if you don't know who she is, you should look her up, phenomenal young lady. She's from back in my hometown area of Atlanta, Georgia there. As a matter of fact, her congressional-- her state house district that she represents overlaps into my community, where I grew up, the Old Fourth Ward neighborhood. And her daughter, her oldest daughter, attends the high school that I attended. Back then, it was Henry Grady High School. Now they changed the name to Midland High School, because you know that Henry Grady guy, he was a white guy. He was a racist guy. And so we could not have his name on a high school. I think he was the founder of the Atlanta Journal Constitution, you know, great orator, newsman.

And so when I think about Mesha Mainor and what she did, she just recently decided to change her party affiliation from Democrat to Republican. And when we had our interview-- and hopefully you'll tune into it-- I asked her why, and she shared why. I'm not-- spoiler alert, I'm not going to tell you. But the interesting thing is that because of her changing her party affiliation, she's been viciously attacked, called horrible racist names, things of this nature, same type of things that I get called.
